- 1. Call to order at 6:03PM.
- 2. City Council Update with Lisa Goodman
 - a. Lunch with Lisa on February 1 from Noon-1PM (special guest is Brian O'Hara)
 - b. Next Lunch with Lisa February 22 (topic TBD)
 - c. City budget was approved.
 - d. Talks of possible one sided parking on streets because of snow emergencies.
 - e. Call 311 for any streets that need to be plowed.
 - f. Crime stats are improving, specifically carjackings.
- 3. Palio
 - a. Setting up for the event has been a good way to connect with participating neighborhoods.
 - b. Gathering at Triangle Park at 1:30PM.
 - c. We need EINA volunteers.
- 4. Open board position:
 - a. Henry LaBounta was the only application received for the vacant board position.
 - b. Motion for Henry LaBounta to be voted in for the vacant board position. Approved unanimously.
- 5. Consent Agenda:
 - a. December minutes approved unanimously.
- 6. General Updates:
 - a. We bought \$1,000 worth of advertisement in Southwest Voices before EOY 2022. Also purchased a device used for remote casting of board meetings.
 - b. Brian (Treasurer)
 - i. We should see actuals for last year's Farmers Market by February 2023.
 - ii. Farmers Market
 - 1. Ballpark expenses in 2022 were \$20,000.
 - 2. Motion to defer EINA financial support for the 2023 East Isles
 Farmers Market and allow time for the EINA Board to conduct a

thorough analysis of options for the market and EINA's future role, if any. 9 voted for the motion. Mike Erlandson abstained.

- The financial statement of the 2022 market is yet to be received and should be presented at the February meeting.
- 7. Luminary Loppet Update with Claire Wilson
 - a. Currently so much snow on the lake that it's covering the slush which has put the Loppet in an interesting predicament.
 - i. Race is unlikely to happen because it probably won't freeze in time. More likely that the race will happen at Theo Wirth Park.
 - ii. Proposal to groom the walking path for skiing.
 - iii. Talks about either postponing the Luminary Loppet portion or even canceling, given the situation about the ice not freezing on the lake.
 - 1. EINA will include the event and its purpose in our next newsletter.
 - iv. Larry suggested they name the snowmobile after us for a year in honor of the donation from EINA.
